

Financial Aid Not Enough?

Try one of these options:

Payment Plan:

- ❖ **Tiffin University Payment Plans:** Tiffin University offers the Monthly Payment Plan (MPP) as an alternative to standard payment arrangements. The MPP enables families to pay college billed expenses in regular monthly payments. If you need more information or wish to sign up for the payment plan, please contact our Bursar at 1-800-968-6446 ext. 3409.

Additional Loans:

- ❖ **Federal Parent Plus Loan:** parent may borrow plus funds processed by T.U. to cover the remaining cost, repayment begins 60 days after loan is full disbursed, current interest rate is 6.10%. If you would like to apply for a Parent Plus loan, please visit our Tiffin University website at www.tiffin.edu. Under financial aid and downloadable forms, click on the "Pre-Application for Parent Plus Loan". Please send to the financial aid when complete for further processing.
- ❖ **Alternative Loans:** the loan is in student's name (with possible co-borrower). Most of these loans offer deferment of repayment until six months after graduation **or until** six months after falling below half-time as a student. When considering this option please compare repayment options, interest rates and the origination fees of each loan.
