### **COMMENTS**

CUL390 01 New Orleans Traditions & Rebirth: In the same tradition as our Education Abroad Programs, a domestic program of studying away from the Tiffin Campus and Ohio itself will benefit students who have not experienced the diversity of American Culture. Each year a different city will be the subject of cultural, historical and environmental study. Students will meet weekly for classroom study for the first half of the semester, prior to actual exploration of the city, which will take place during one week of Spring Break and be the culmination of the course (with an accompanying paper).

New Orleans: Tradition and Rebirth will be a four-day visit to New Orleans, Louisiana to discuss and study the French Quarter, Garden District, and the disaster-ravaged ward areas (Lower Ninth Ward and St. Bernard Parish, along with the Little Vietnam neighborhoods of East New Orleans). Special focus will be placed on pre-Katrina and post-Katrina aspects of the city. The tour will be a collaboration of science, art, history, and musical experiences within New Orleans. Additional tours will be provided including possibly a cooking class, graveyard tours, plantation visits, and other cultural aspects of the great city. The course will be worth 3 credit hours and be limited to a total of 20 students. Estimated costs approximately \$1000 per student in addition to tuition charge.
