1st offense	1 year from date of conviction	2 years from date of conviction
2nd offense	2 years from date of conviction	Indefinite period
3+ offenses	Indefinite period	Indefinite period
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Convictions for both the sale & possession will result in a loss of eligibility for the longer period.• For a conviction during the semester where you received aid, we will have to return all aid received leaving you with a bill at the University.
