Learn scientific principles and tactics as preparation for application to medical school or to assist criminal and civil investigations through chemistry, biology and law.

Learn crime scene review and processes from high-level professors who have experience in crime scene analysis, secret service detail, forensics and criminal justice. They will teach you autopsy collection of evidence, forensic anthropology, bone identification, ballistics, courtroom testimony, evidence and fingerprint examination. With a focus on experiential learning, our cutting-edge program will prepare you for the real-world. You will gain hands-on training in our innovative science lab with state-of-the-art equipment. Forensic science students can also link theory to practice in our new Criminal Justice and Social Science Experiential Learning Center equipped with a crime scene house. Because forensic science is a scientific field based on scientific methods and laboratory applications, students completing this degree can seek employment not just in forensic science labs, but also in commercial and industrial labs.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the demand for employment of forensic science technicians is expected to grow 14 percent until 2028. The median annual wage for forensic science technicians was \$59,150 in May 2019. Employment for laboratory technicians is projected to grow 11 percent until 2028. In May 2019, the median annual wage for laboratory technicians was \$53,120.
