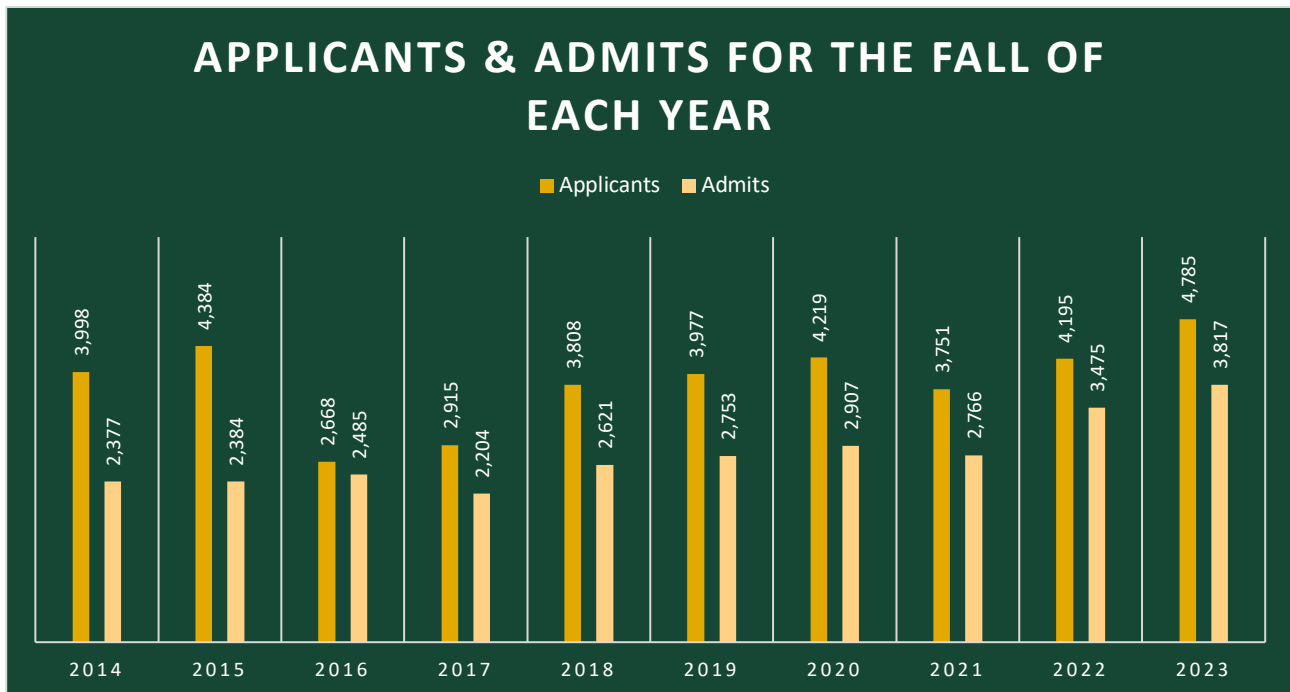

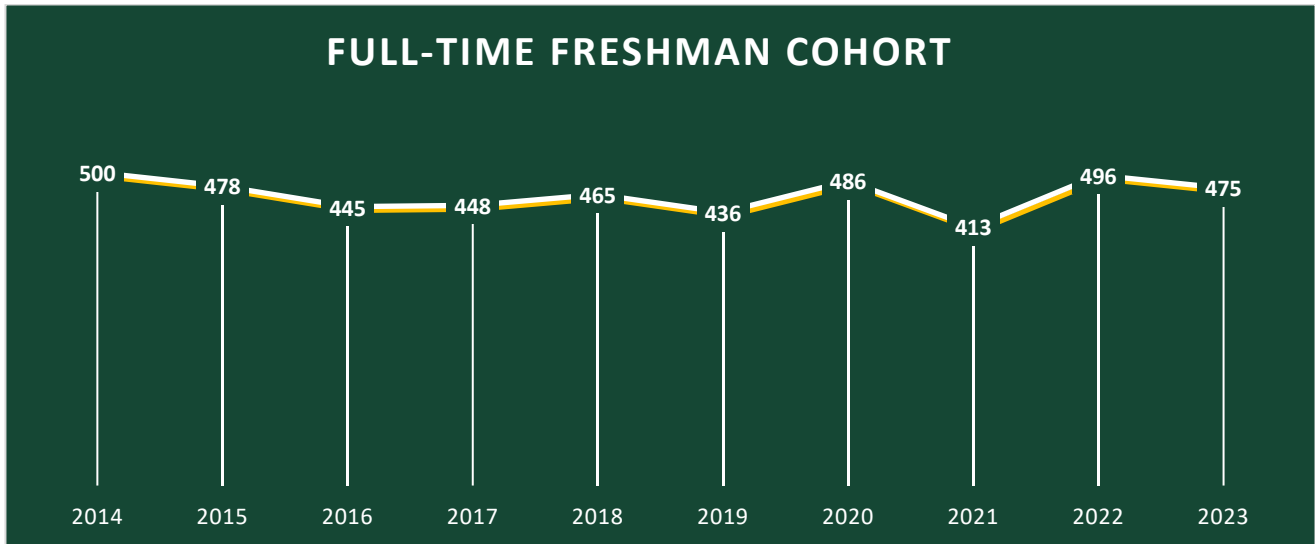

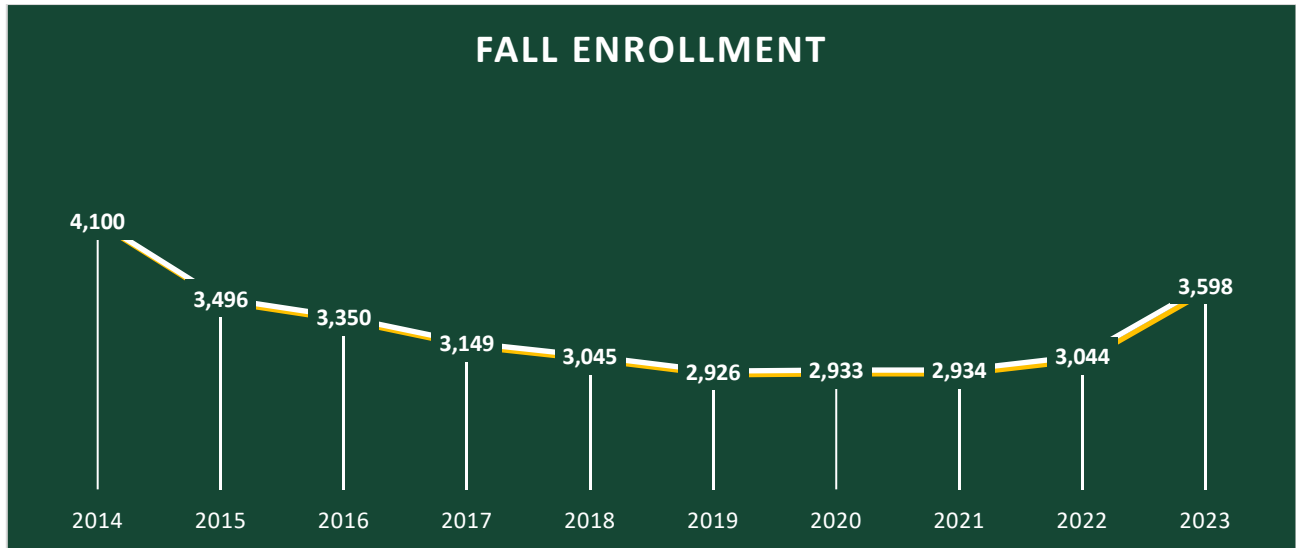

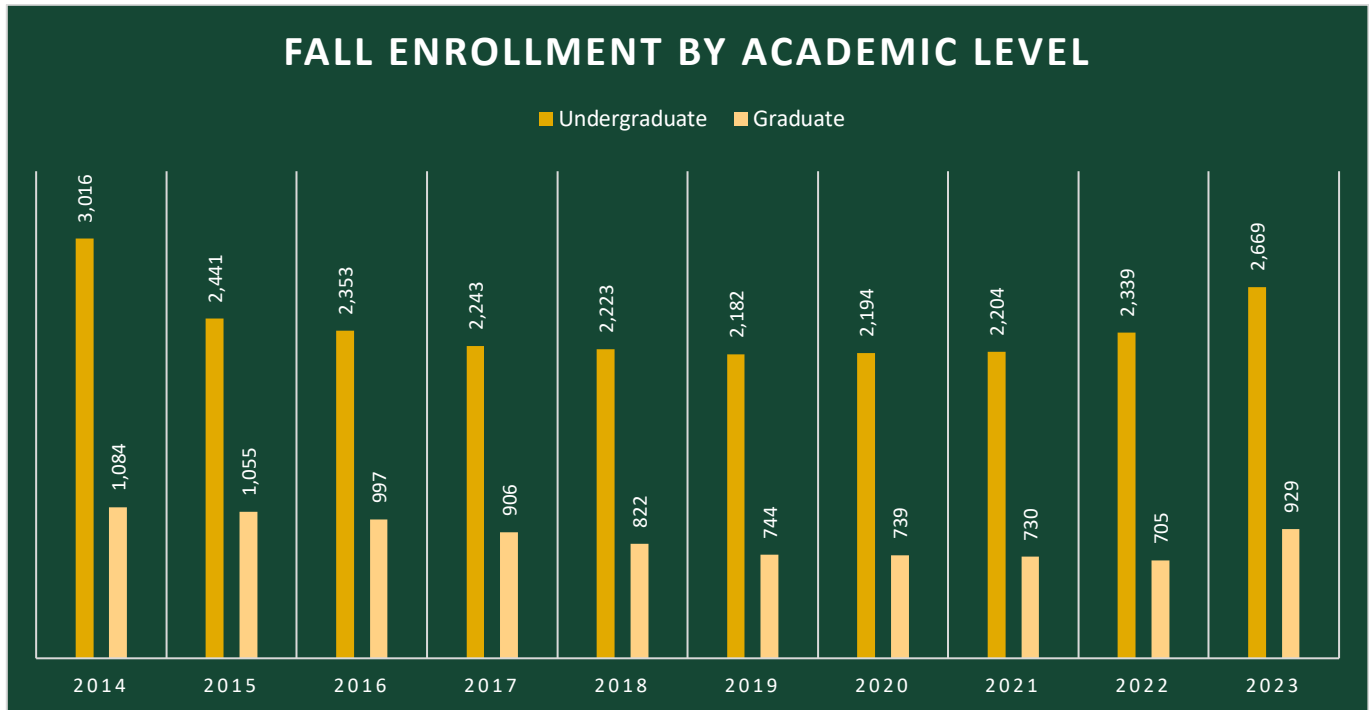

FALL ENROLLMENT TRENDS



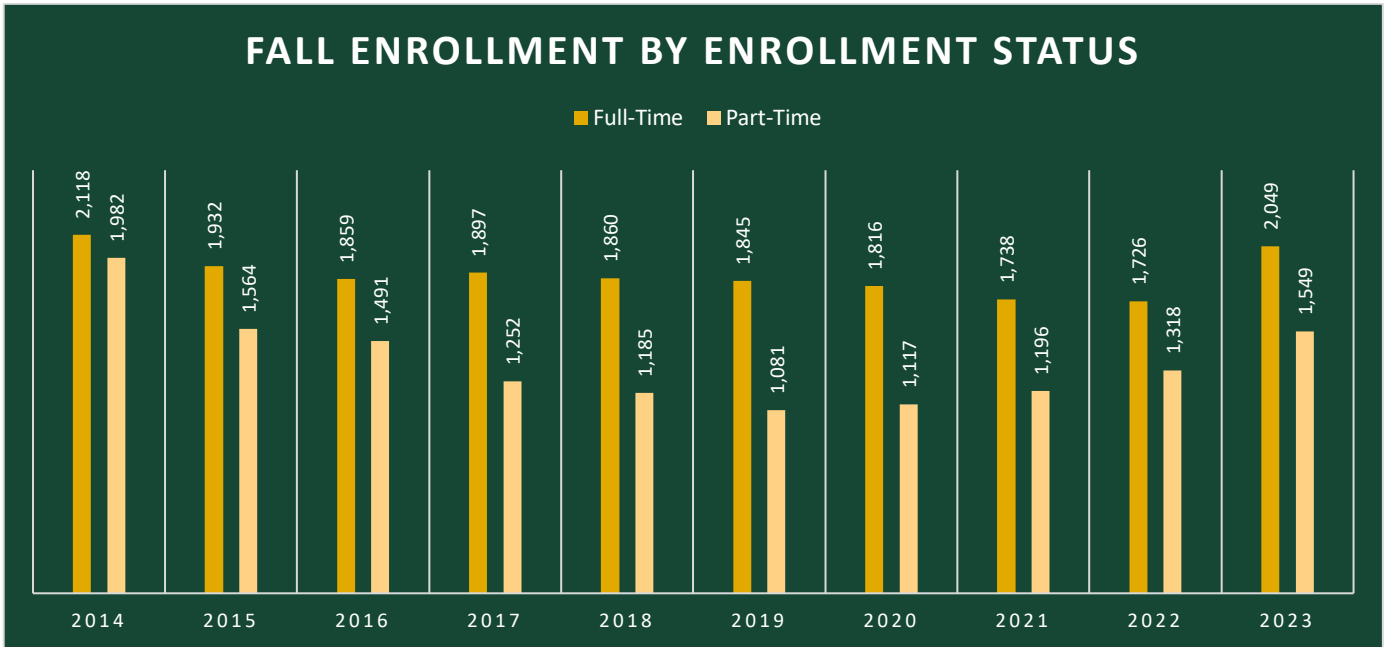

ENROLLMENT BY ACADEMIC LEVEL



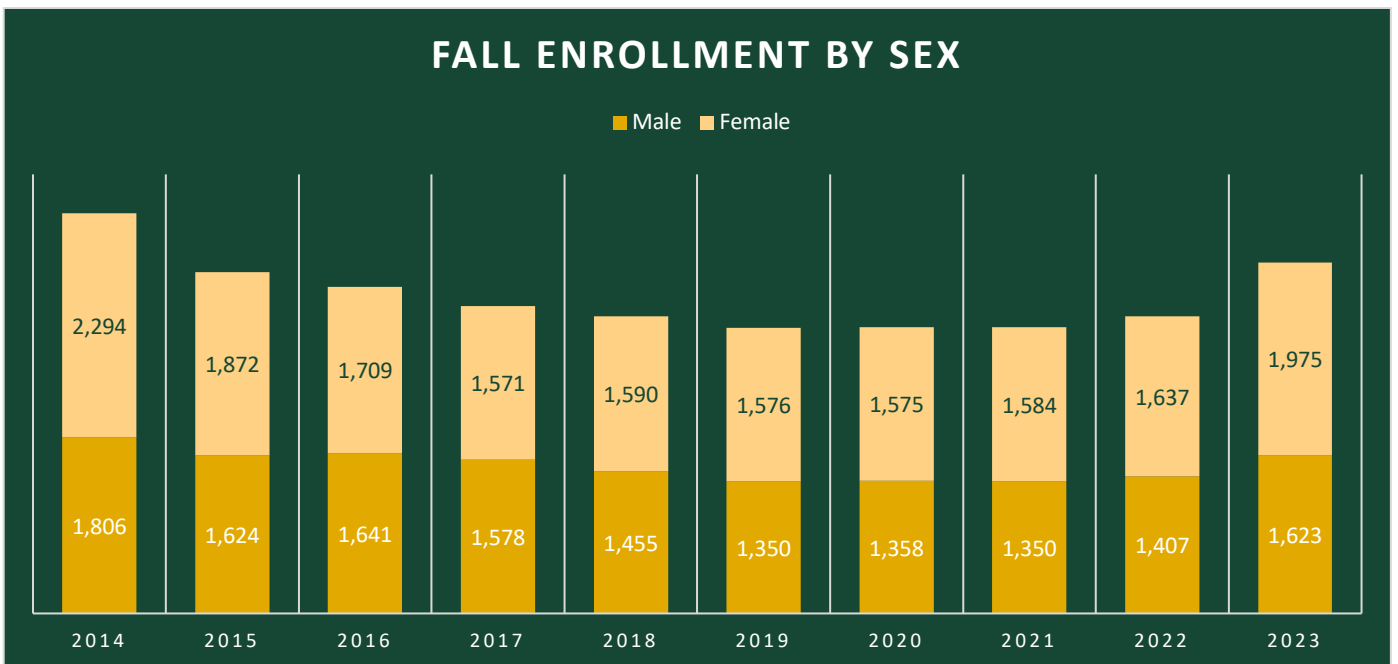

ENROLLMENT BY STATUS



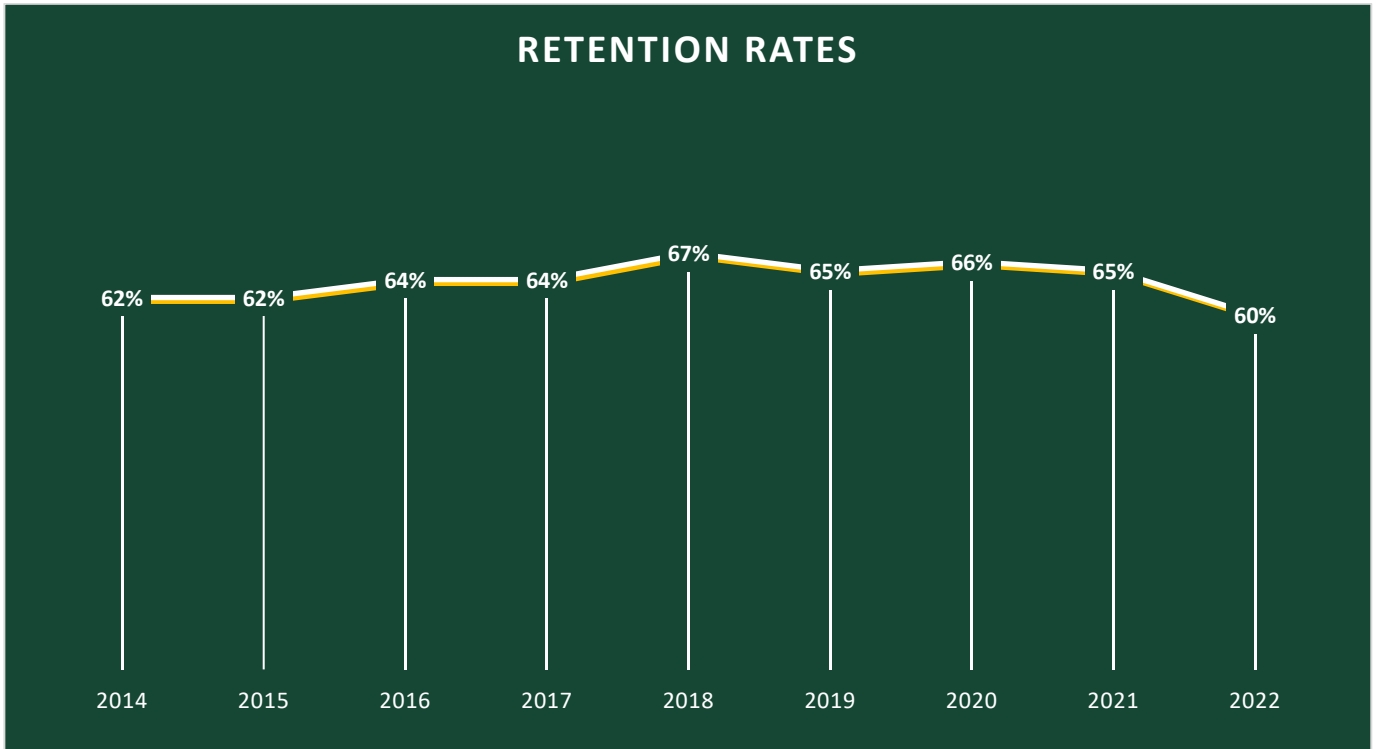

ENROLLMENT BY SEX

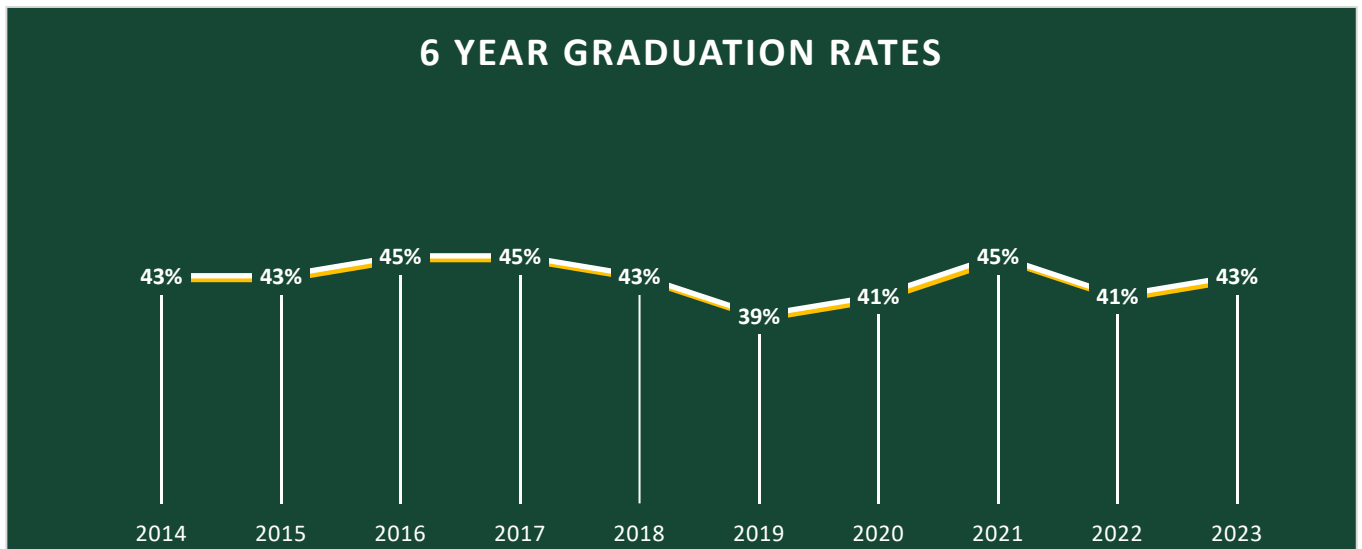

6 YEAR GRADUATION RATES - PURSUING BACHELOR'S DEGREES



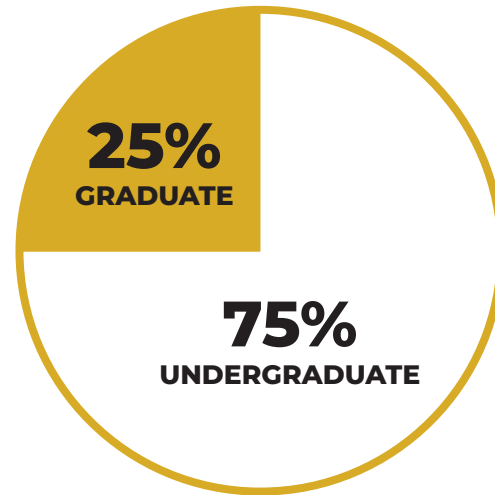

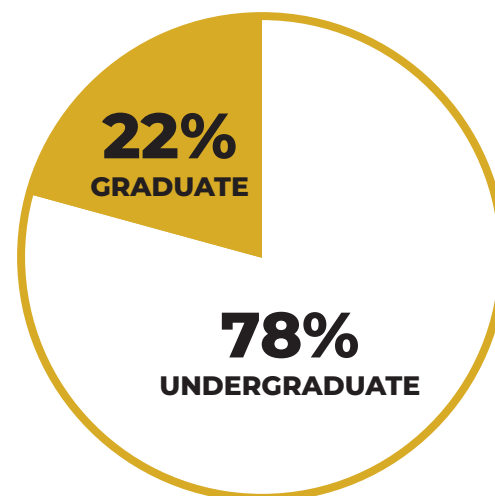


12-MONTH STUDENT ENROLLMENT BY LEVEL

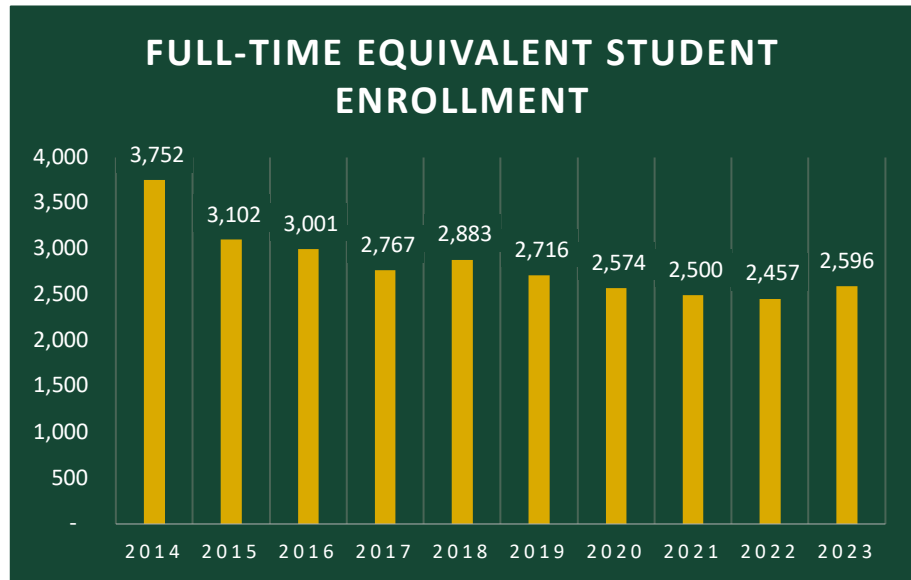

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT 12-MONTH STUDENT ENROLLMENT

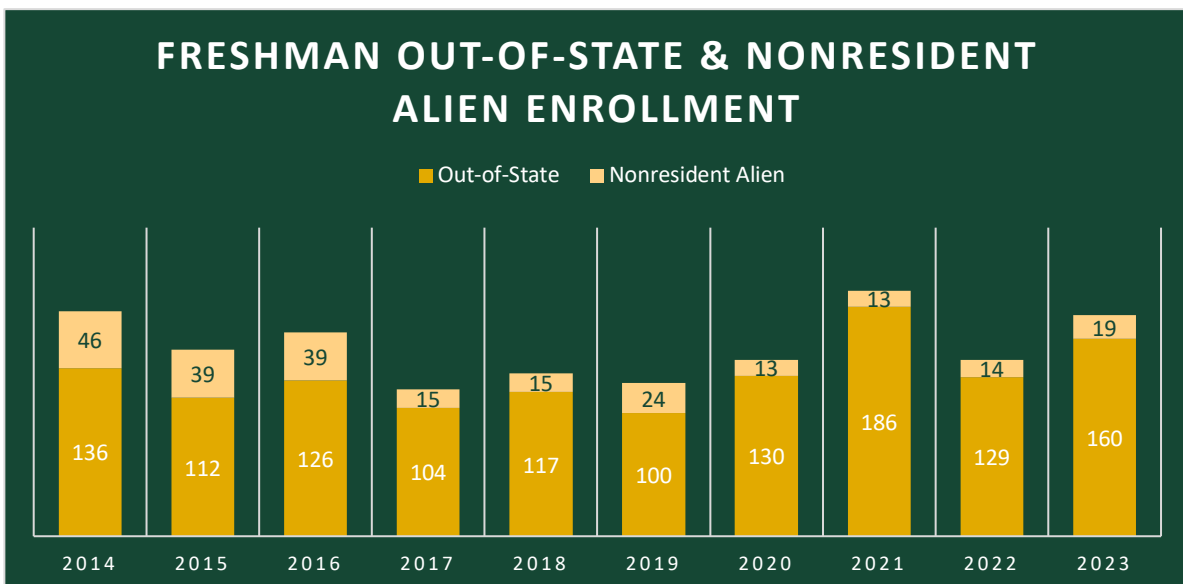

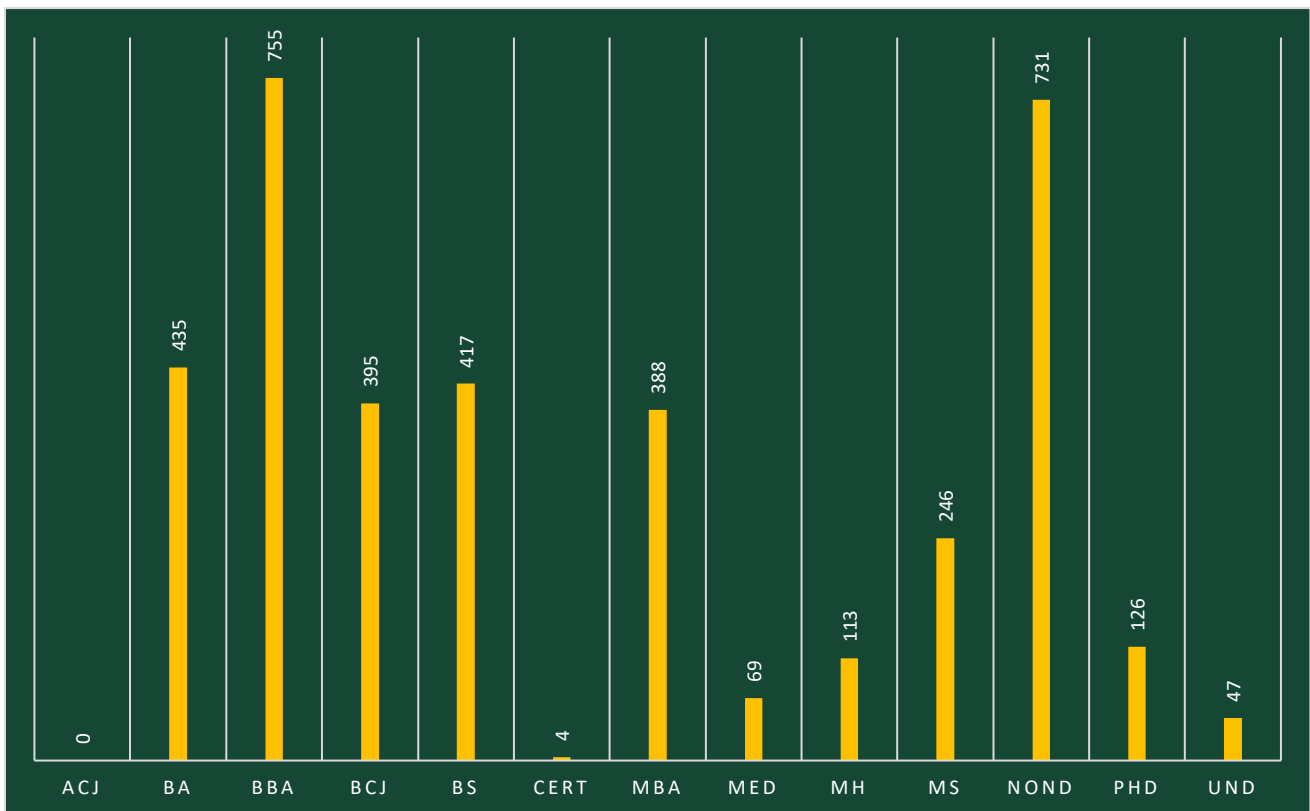

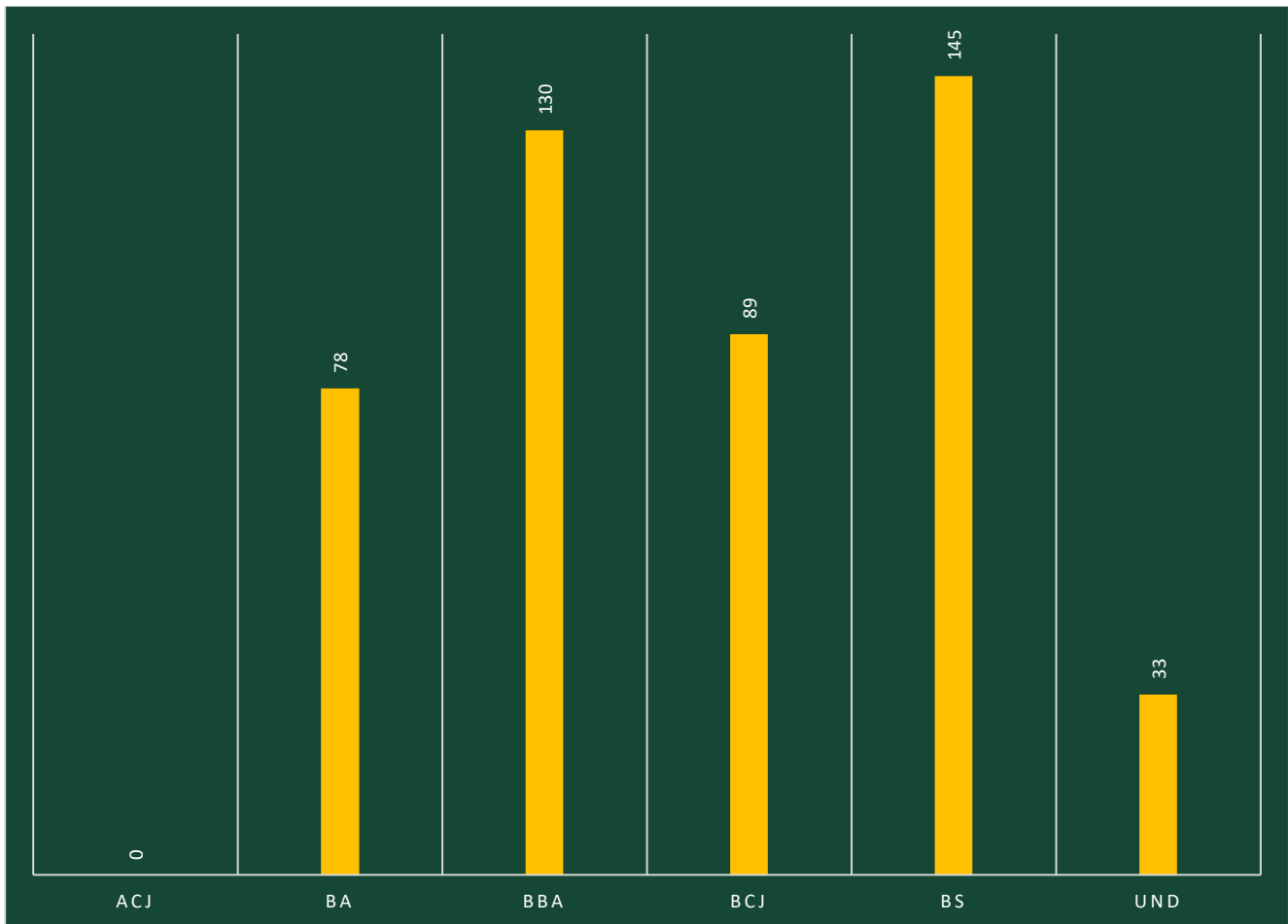

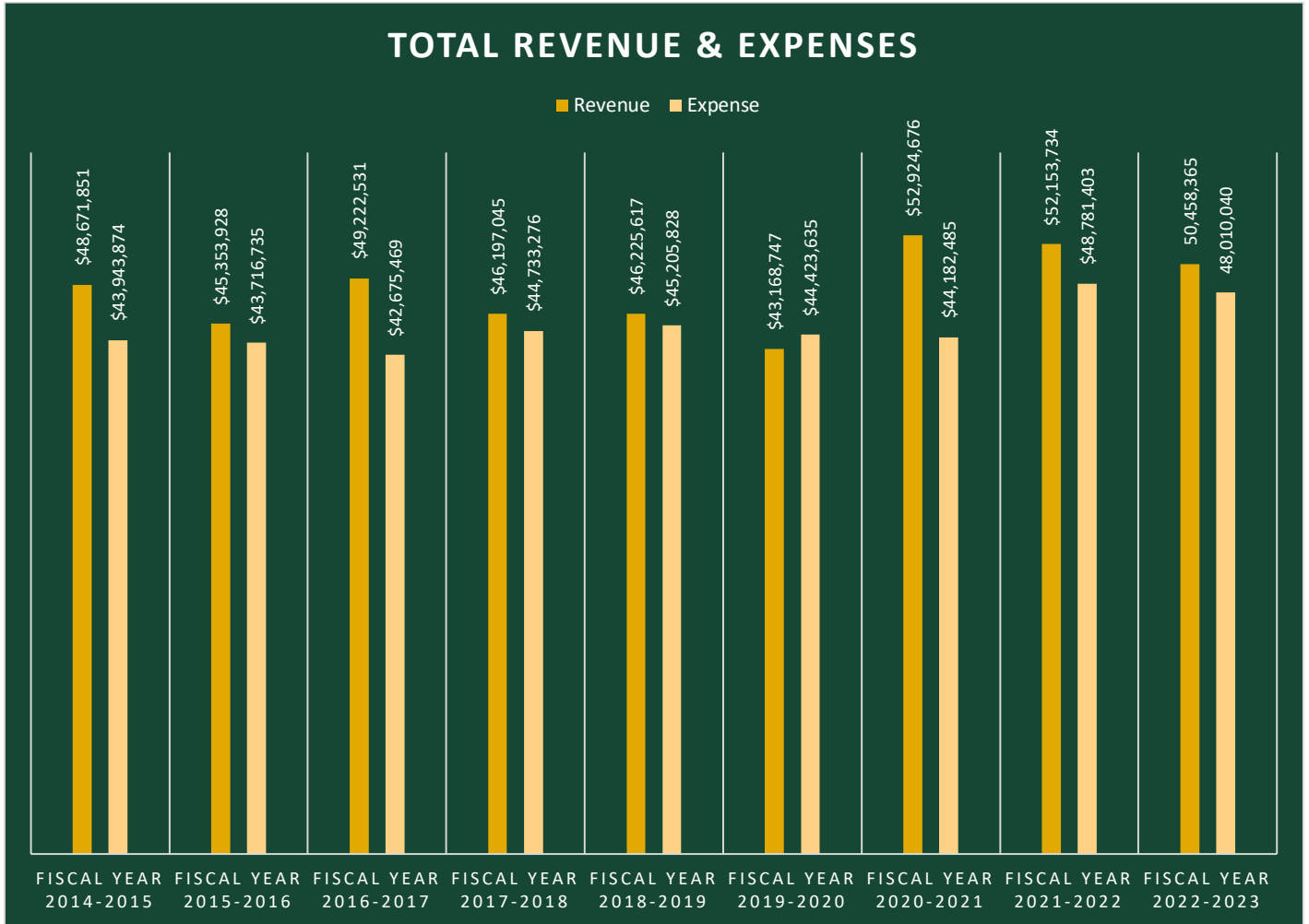

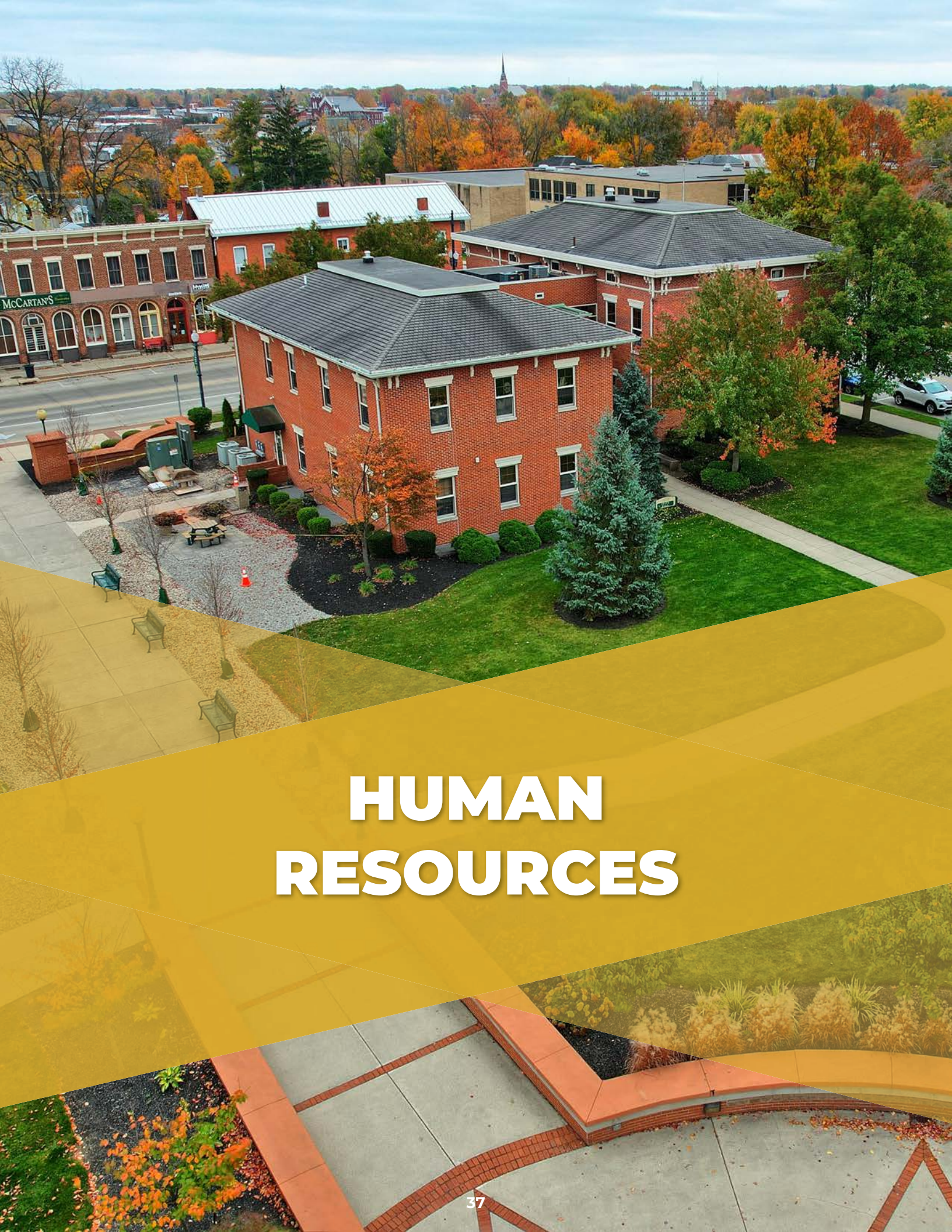

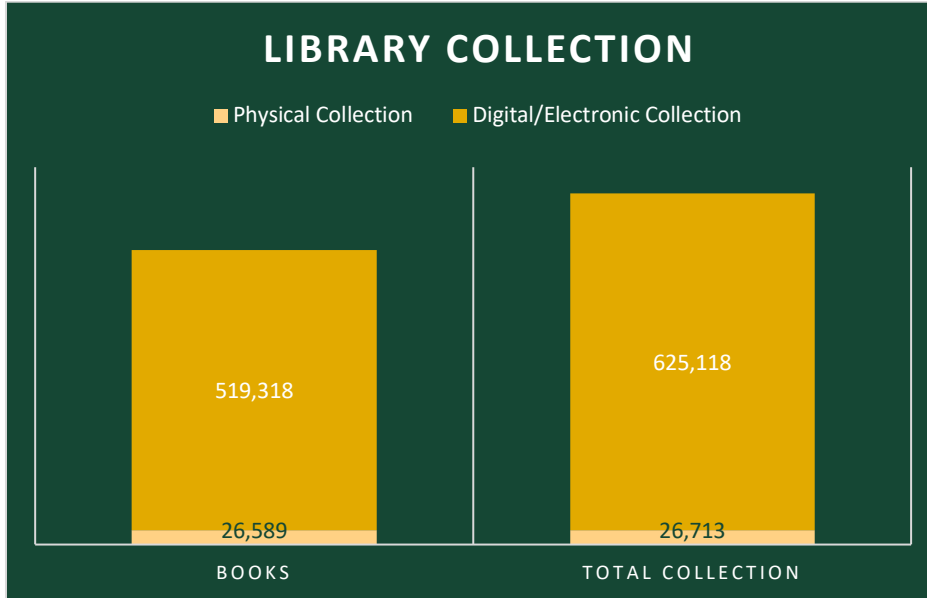

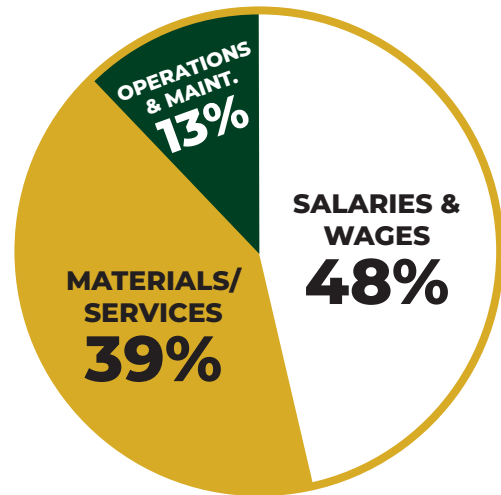
