






## **FALL ENROLLMENT TRENDS**





## ENROLLMENT BY ACADEMIC LEVEL





## **ENROLLMENT BY STATUS**



## **ENROLLMENT BY SEX**




## **RETENTION RATES**

## 6 YEAR GRADUATION RATES - PURSUING BACHELOR'S DEGREE





## 2023-2024 ACADEMIC YEAR 12 MONTH HEADCOUNT






