


BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION IN ACCOUNTING

Why Tiffin University School of Business?

What can I do on campus to improve my experience?

Tiffin University supports the Accounting and Finance Club, a student-driven organization that puts students in the spotlight allowing them to create tailored experiences and networking opportunities. The club hosts annual events including Knowing your Certifications and Tax Day, where students discuss tax requirements with their fellow students. Meet the Firms night is also hosted on campus, where over twenty accounting and financial firms come and meet with students. The club also arranges employer visits, professional engagements on campus and travel experiences to cities like Chicago and Pittsburgh.

High-achieving students often work with faculty leaders to participate in off-campus case study competitions. Tiffin has historically sent many groups to compete against other colleges, giving students yet another experience to help them learn and grow as professionals.
