

# PREVALENCE

Sexual violence on college campuses is pervasive. The following sexual violence statistics were reported by the Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network (RAINN):

**13%** OF ALL STUDENTS

**9.7%** OF FEMALE GRADUATE STUDENTS

**26.4%** OF FEMALE UNDERGRAD STUDENTS

**2.5%** OF MALE GRADUATE STUDENTS

**6.8%** OF MALE UNDERGRAD STUDENTS

experience rape or sexual assault through physical force, violence, or incapacitation

**23.1%** OF TGQN\* STUDENTS have been sexually assaulted

# TU POLICY

## SEXUAL ASSAULT

A forcible or nonforcible sex offense including penetrative sexual assault, fondling, incest, and statutory rape.

## CONSENT

Knowing, and voluntary, and clear permission by word or action to engage in sexual activity.

## INCAPACITATION

A person cannot consent if they are unable to understand what is happening or is disoriented, helpless, asleep, or unconscious, for any reason, including by alcohol or other drugs.

### DID YOU KNOW?

About 50% of sexual assaults on college campuses involve a situation where alcohol was being consumed.

**TIP: Wait until all parties are sober BEFORE engaging in sexual activity**



## I PLEDGE...

To **RECOGNIZE** that non-consensual sex is sexual assault.

To **IDENTIFY** situations in which sexual assault may occur.

To **INTERVENE** in situation where consent has not or cannot be given.

To **CREATE** an environment in which sexual assault is unacceptable and survivors are supported.

# BYSTANDER STRATEGIES

Preventing sexual assault is everyone's responsibility - it's on all of us to be active bystanders and to keep our campus community safe. As a bystander, you can help prevent sexual violence by using one of the following bystander strategies:

## DIRECT

If the situation is safe, directly assist someone who needs help.  
**i.e. Telling the involved party, "That behavior is not welcome here"**

## DISTRACT

A distraction helps to divert the attention of those involved in the situation so they stop what they are doing.  
**i.e. Asking the involved party where the restroom is**

## DELEGATE

Enlist someone else to step in to help with the situation.  
**i.e. Calling campus security**
