






Question: Were you a transfer student to this school with more than 20 credit hours?




Question: Do you understand the importance of the Major Field Test?




Question: Your Age




The bars in the following graph displays the mean of the survey item and the red line represents the mean of the survey item means. This information can be used to understand how various assessment items compared against each other.

There was nothing that I liked least about my academic experience. The only inconvenience that I had is that I was initially graduating upon completion of term 1 in the fall. However, one of the classes that I was taking is only offering during the fall of term 2 which slightly pushed my graduation date back.

As a graduate student taking online courses at Tiffin University, I found navigating the self-directed nature of online coursework may at times feel overwhelming, especially when juggling multiple responsibilities.

The math class I took, it was the only B I had in my program. It messed up my GPA, I would have to pull all-nighters and it still wasn't enough.

The aspect I liked least about my academic experience was the occasional lack of alignment between theory and practice, making it challenging to see the direct application of certain concepts. Additionally, some assignments felt overly focused on memorization rather than fostering critical thinking and creativity. Lastly, time constraints during group projects sometimes hindered collaboration and prevented us from fully exploring ideas.

My least favorite part of my academic experience was the lack of a week off to transition between classes last semester. Being an online student during the summer is challenging enough with the breaks in between. I was thrown off by the harsh transition between terms with no week long break like other semesters.

Sometimes the workload would be a little overwhelming. But I am working full-time, so that plays a big part in it.

Our email access being switched to a different platform.

The assignments in some courses were brutal in third party applications. However, I enjoyed writing papers related to the topic we discussed each week. For one of the classes, we were given to write a paper on a scholarly article which were occurring in the week or happened in the past week. I truly enjoyed going into depth with the assignments.

I didn't like the level of requirements for the discussion posts



I did not enjoy the group assignments that professors would put the class in. It was difficult to get everyone together because of the different time zones.

Also, there were professors who did not answer emails in a timely manner causing members of the class to stress out regarding if we were completing the assignment correctly or not.

There were classes that I feel like I did not need for sports management as they more just general business management courses.

Group projects, though they were minimal. I'm in an online course because I need flexibility with work and family needs and it was sometimes challenging to work with a group

The inconsistencies in APA expectations based on which professor you had at the time.

Honestly I enjoyed the whole experience. Although, it does get cumbersome when different professors have different ideas about how papers should be formatted in APA format. I feel like as soon as I got the hang of citations and formatting I started another class and that professor wanted something different than the last.

Group work was a struggle with a completely online course and group members who did not pull their weight or take assignments seriously.

There is no teaching rather just doing your own research and writing about it

I felt the group projects were challenging as this is an online program and we all work at different speeds.

At times I felt that Sports business specific classes within my degree could have taught me about more about the professional sports landscape within North America rather then the global sports landscape. This is opinionated but at times I felt I would have been better off learning about how front offices within professional sports are operated rather then how to format an olympic bid for a specific sport. I think that from my perspective I would have enjoyed learning more about North American Sports and roles within professional sports businesses as this would be more applicable to me since this is where I reside.

I struggled with not having enough hours in the day. It is difficult to study when working a full-time job, but I made it work.

What I liked least about my academic experience was the occasional lack of practical application for some theoretical concepts. Sometimes it felt like there was a disconnect between what we were learning and how it would apply in the real world.

There were a few courses that felt very heavy handed in terms of written essays. I understand the nature of online work requires the student to clearly articulate they understand the concepts, but the number of essays did get to be rather daunting week after week.

One aspect I didn't enjoy as much during my academic experience was the economics classes. I found the content to be challenging and sometimes difficult to engage with, especially when it came to the abstract theories and complex concepts. While I appreciate the importance of economics in understanding broader societal issues, I personally didn't find the subject matter as stimulating or directly relevant to my career interests. The pace of the classes was also something that I struggled with at times, as I preferred subjects where I could directly apply what I was learning in practical, real-world contexts.

I didn't appreciate the general business courses I took my first two terms that were not relevant to the major specific needs. I honestly would've completed the degree earlier with no issues based on missed courses. While I understand that they were considered needed with my non-business background, they didn't help me in later courses as much as it was implied by my advisor.
