




Question: Were you a transfer student to this school with more than 20 credit hours?




Question: Do you understand the importance of the Major Field Test?




Question: Your Age






The bars in the following graph displays the mean of the survey item and the red line represents the mean of the survey item means. This information can be used to understand how various assessment items compared against each other.






I know that there are many students in the class, but when we turned in some of our work, the grading would come back too slow for me to correct the mistakes I made before having to turn in the next assignment. for example, I made a mistake in some of the APA formats of my paper and two papers/assignments would go by before the professor would grade the paper, but by then I lost points on something I could have corrected if i would have gotten the paper/ assignment back sooner.

I got docked a ridiculous amount of points when I feel I completed my work (from a previous course) exactly how my professor asked. The directions stated to "cite two sources beyond the textbook" to me, this means to cite two sources that are NOT the textbook. This wording is the reason why I did not cite the textbook, (as it said "beyond") and the reason my grade got dropped from a 4.0 which I worked very hard for, down to a 3.5. These directions could have been worded any other way, and should be for future students. Overall, every other class I enjoyed.

The format was great for adult learners like me. There were a lot of assignments, specifically writing assignments, that made it difficult to have any time outside of work and school. It was nice that there was a break between terms to refresh before the next set of classes started.
